FY 2013-14 Budget Update

- Tuition and registration fee receipts lagging budgeted level by approximately 5-6%
 - Decline in enrollment
 - Increase in proportion of students eligible for tuition waivers
 - Increase in ratio of student hours : credit hours
 - As a result, college budgets were revised downward by 0.4% in January

Developmental Dividend



2014 Budget Priorities

- Retain and reinvest \$36.9 million
 - Enrollment adjustment (\$18.1 m)
 - Existing non-recurring funds (\$18.8 m)
- Reinvestment priorities
 - Closing the Skills Gap \$16.8 million
 - Increasing Quality \$20.1 million
 - Raise all tiers by 1.7%
 - Colleges could use funds flexibly

Salary Increases

- North Carolina's average faculty salary
 - Ranks 11th in the 16-state Southeast Regional Education Board (SREB) area
 - Ranks 41st nationally
- The average faculty salary for the nation and the SREB region are 30 percent and 10 percent greater, respectively, than the North Carolina average.
- NC community college faculty make, on average, only \$1,330 more than the average NC public school teacher.
- While comparative data on faculty salaries is readily available, staff salaries are also of concern.



Summer Term

- Starting Summer 2014, student hours in the following courses will count toward budget FTE:
 - "technical education, health care...and STEMrelated courses" = TIER 1
 - See Curriculum Procedures Reference Manual, Section
 21
 - "developmental education" = DMA, DMS, MAT 050, DRE, ENG <100, RED <100</p>
- Summer 2014 FTE will count toward 2015-16
 BFTE



Performance-Based Funding

- FY 2013-14: \$9 million allocated based on performance of six performance measures
 - \$1.5 million per measure
- FY 2014-15: \$24 million allocated based on performance on eight measures
 - +3.0 million per measure
 - The \$6 million associated with the Basic Skills measures will be part of the Basic Skills Block Grant allocation.



Future of PBF?

- Original performance-based funding plan submitted to General Assembly:
 - Established a goal of allocating \$5 million per measure
 - Committed to revisiting baseline and goals every three years
- Employment measure?
- New model?
