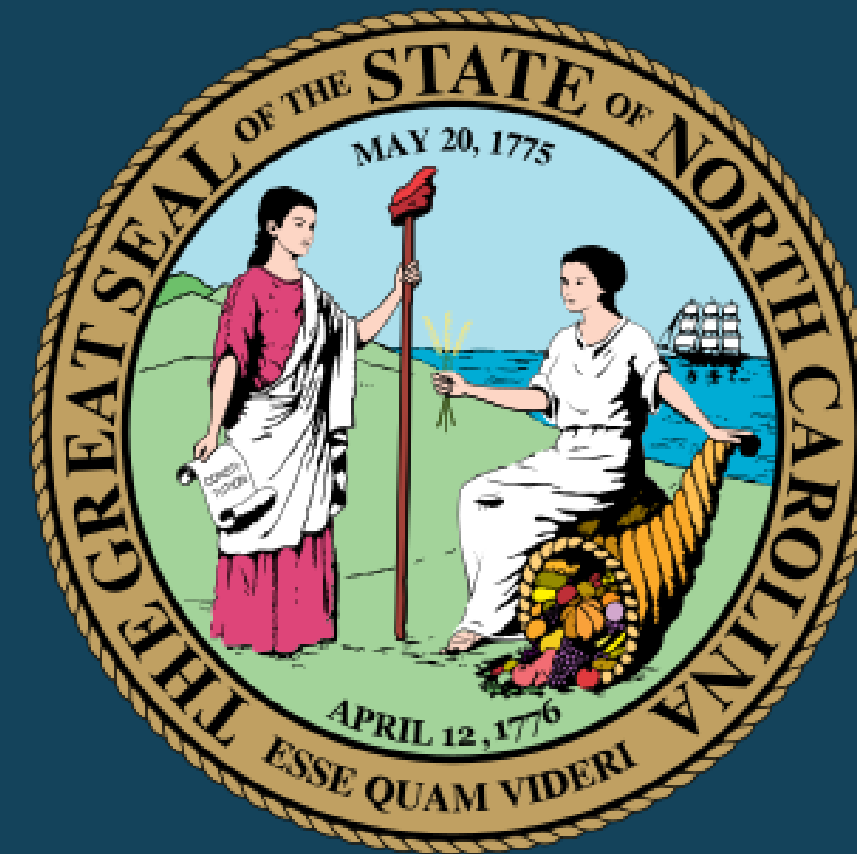
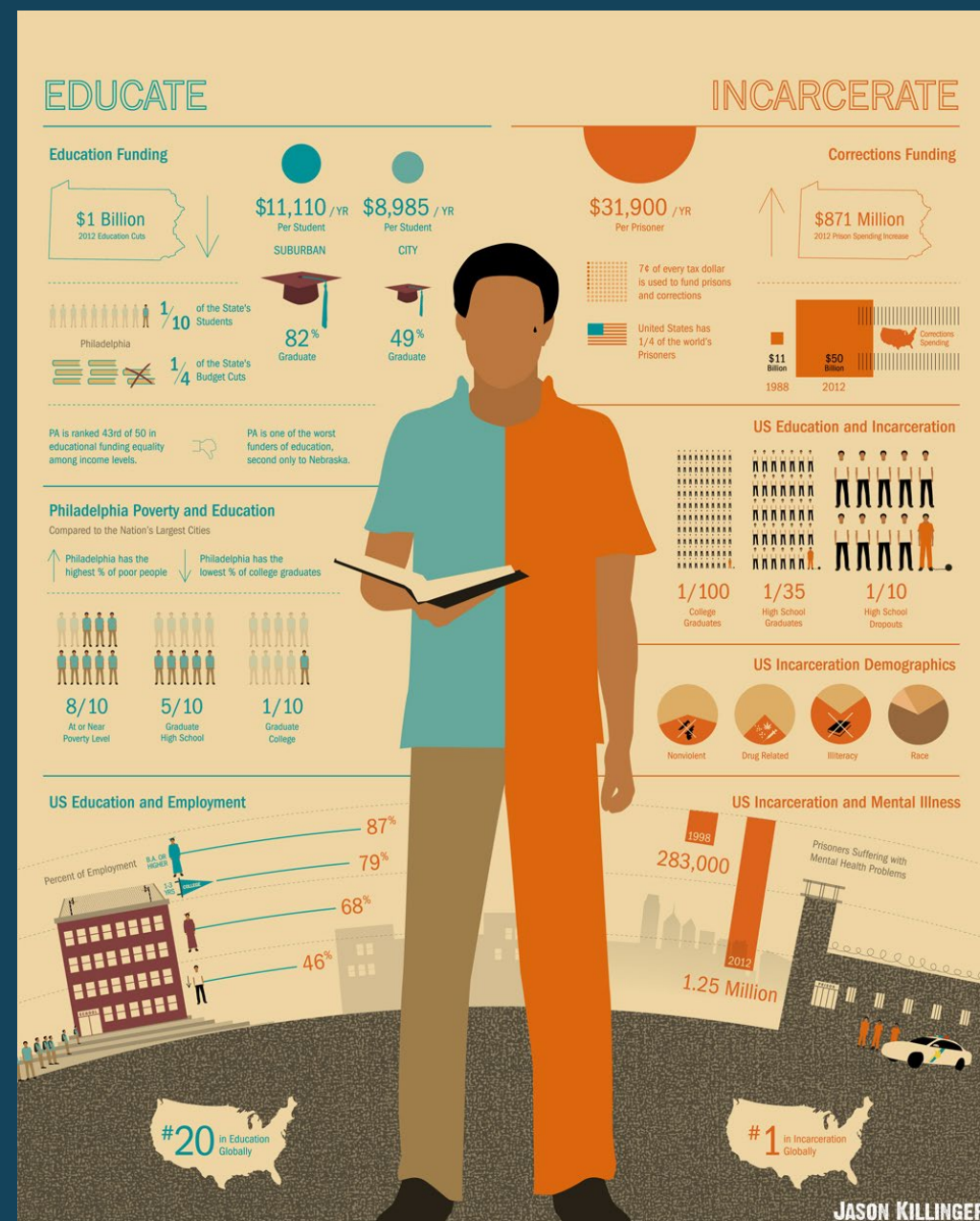

FAFSA “Simplification”

The US Department of Ed will begin releasing ISIRs (student FASFA data) in March. Colleges are still awaiting the Ellucian patch. The S.O. financial aid team and FA Review Committee have worked diligently to position your FA Offices to award as soon as they begin receiving ISIRs. On February 15, Brandi Massey notified colleges that the FA template patch is available, and that Annual Setup registration is open. The FA Setup Guide will be available soon.

Common Digital Transcript

In Session Law 2023 Section 8A.15, the Common Digital Transcript project is assigned to SEAA. The three public education sectors (public schools, UNC, & NCCCS) are mandated to participate in the design, development, and maintenance of a common digital transcript that is (1) available to all students, (2) secure/confidential, (3) compatible with all 3 sectors, and (4) free of cost to students. The first progress report is due March 15, 2024. System Office staff have participated in two planning meetings where direction and design are being discussed.

Next NC Scholarship

Next NC Scholarship is the new version of the NC scholarship administered by the NC State Education Assistance Authority (SEAA) (nextncscholarship.org).
